
Profitability: 63% of technology leading law firms reported increased profits in 2022, more than any other group surveyed







Talent: 83% of lawyers say it is important to work in a firm that leverages technology well






Client-firm relations: 70% of in-house legal teams reported asking firms they considered hiring to describe the tech they use to be more productive and efficient




